
ROADMAP TO NEPHROLOGY NURSING CERTIFCATION



FOR THE NURSE WANTING TO GET CERTIFIED:

1 Understand Eligibility Criteria & Requirements

Ensure you meet the requirements for certification through the Nephrology Nursing Certification Commission (NNCC):

- Licensure: Hold a full and unrestricted RN license in the United States or its territories.
- Experience: Complete a minimum of 3,000 hours in nephrology nursing within the past 3 years. For outpatient hemodialysis facilities, at least 750 hours (25%) must include experience in areas like:
 - Home hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis
 - Inpatient kidney replacement therapy (acute or critical care).
 - CKD management, kidney transplant, or apheresis.
- Education: Hold a baccalaureate or master's degree in nursing.

2 Explore Certification Options

Choose the certification that aligns with your goals:

- ✓ Certified Nephrology Nurse (CNN)
- ✓ Certified Nephrology Nurse-Nurse Practitioner (CNN-NP)
- ✓ Certified Dialysis Nurse (CDN)
- Other NNCC certifications (e.g., CCHT, CCHT-A, CD-LPN).

3 Prepare Your Application

Submit your forms and fees:

- Access the online application through the NNCC website.
- Gather necessary documents: nursing license, proof of hours, and continuing education certificates.
- Pay the required fees and review the NNCC policies for certification.



4 Study and Answer Practice Questions

Utilize resources to prepare for the exam:

- Certification Review Course: Complete ANNA's self-paced online Certification review course or attend local chapter review events.
- Study Materials:
 - Ownload the Certification Preparation Guide.
 - Review the test blueprint and specifications to identify high-weight content areas.
 - Familiarize yourself with the exam reference list.
- Practice Exams: Take the online practice exam provided by NNCC and focus on weaker areas.
- Study Strategies:
 - Join a study group.
 - Shadow a colleague in areas you need to strengthen.
 - Review nephrology nursing textbooks systematically.

6 Prepare for Exam Day

Be physically and emotionally ready:

- Get a good night's sleep and eat a balanced meal before the exam.
- Gather necessary materials: government-issued photo ID, nursing license, examination permit, sweater or jacket.
- Arrive early to the testing site.
- Use anxiety reducing-techniques like relaxation exercises or guided imagery.

6 Take the Exam

Tips for Success:

- Read questions carefully and focus on key terms like "first," "most likely," or "best."
- Answer based on the information provided without overthinking.
- Manage your time wisely, marking uncertain question for review later.
- ✓ Use as much of the allotted time as needed.

Maintain Your Certification

Plan for recertification:

- ✓ Track and complete continuing education hours.
- Stay updated on NNCC policies and requirements for maintaining your credential.
